January starts our busy time at the General Assembly. Some of us will be attending the League of Women Voters Roundtable every Wednesday morning starting on **January 18th at 8:30 AM** room 4 East in the General Assembly Building. Delegates and Senators will speak on their bills that are of interest to us. At 9:30 you can go to your legislators and lobby. Either write notes or make appointments with their legislative assistants.

Check out http://virginiageneralassembly.gov/ and http://lis.virginia.gov/ if you need bill tracking information or to find out who your legislator is. Right now we are watching SB824 (Wexton) Paid SickLeave, SB978 (Dance) Minimum Wage, and SB1080 (Wexton) Equal Pay.

We hope many of you will attend **AAUW** Lobby Day on February 1st. The day's agenda will begin early (8:30) and should wrap up after lunch. Following our State Lobby Day activities, there will be an optional lunch for AAUW members, as well as for members of the League of Women Voters of Virginia (LWV-VA) and other kindred organizations visiting Richmond. This year, AAUW is organizing the lunch. It has always been a nice ending to a great morning so I hope members participating in Lobby Day can stay for lunch. LOCATION: The Tobacco Company Restaurant, 201 E Cary St. TIME: Staggered arrival between approximately 12:30 -1:00 p.m., depending on when we are recognized in the General Assembly Galleries, which will be the last item on our official agenda.
