In Memoriam

It is with sorrow that we announce the death of former Richmond AAUW member who was active with us for many years, Dr. Virgie M. Binford. She was a teacher, supervisor and consultant with RPS, faculty member of J. Sarge, as well as the first black woman to serve as moderator of Hanover Presbytery;

Public Policy

“On **Tuesday, April 4, 2017** thousands of women across Virginia will join in a national day of action against unfair pay called Equal Pay Day. April is symbolic of the point into the new year that a woman must work in order to earn the wages paid to a man in the previous year. According to the National Partnership for Women and Families, Virginia women are paid 80 cents for every dollar paid to men. This leads to an average annual wage gap of \$10,419.”

This is an excerpt from a letter sent by the Richmond Women’s Law students at the University of Richmond to Mayor Stoney urging him to proclaim **April 4th as Equal Pay Day** for Richmond. They set up a table to gather signatures and were successful in gathering 98! GRAAUW has also requested that **Mayor Stoney** declare April 4th as Equal Pay Day and requested an opportunity to meet with him to discuss ways the city can help to narrow the wage gap.

On April 4th, the Richmond Women’s Law group will be spearheading a letter writing campaign in the commons of the Law School. Students will write their hometown Delegates to urge them to support **Delegate Jennifer Boyko’s bill HB2314** which requires equal pay for equal work for state employees. Now is the time to write your Delegate!

Kathy has been trying to find a local business that would allow a table outside their establishment to hand out information about the Pay Gap, but also to bring attention by handing out free bags of popcorn; full size to women and 80% that size for men. We hope to raise awareness of the public in a tangible fashion. 
