A number of state board members, including our State Co Presidents Sandy Lawrence and Patsy Quick, drove many miles to attend, as did Kate Neilson, the AAUW State Policy Manager, from our national headquarters in DC. Several of our GRAAUW members were also able to attend. Connie Sorrell donated two beautiful flower arrangements to create a festive atmosphere. To our surprise, Del. Public Policy Report

It is our busy time at Capital Square! We had a nice reception for female legislators on January 8. The National Public Policy Chair and our state copresidents attended.

The General Assembly's 60-day session began on January 10. We are now very busy attending the League of Women Voters Roundtable every Wednesday and then contacting various legislative members and/or their staff. Call Kathy Kelley or Carol Stephens if you have any questions. Of particular attention this year are ERA ratification, equal pay and redistricting.

TransparencyVirginia met Jan. 16 to discuss the House adopting Rule 18c that requires recorded votes on all measures. Many in both parties are claiming some credit for this change, proud that they had something to do with it. Lesin Dippold attended, as we have supported this group in the past.

Equal pay, reproductive rights, healthcare access and paid family leave are just some of the policies that will be debated this year. Progress Virginia – the Women's Equity Coalition – is sponsoring *Women's Lobby Day* on January 22, featuring a rally, meetings with representatives, and a chance to tour the Governor's Mansion. Kathy Kelley, Dulce Lawrence and Barb Strohman plan to attend.

Then February 7 is AAUW State Lobby Day. AAUW members will be coming from across the state and there will be a lunch afterward at the Berkeley Hotel. Some of our members will be hosting out of town attendees.

AAUW Funds Report

The most important aspect of fund raising is deciding what will be done with the proceeds. Thanks to the increasingly popular Wine Tasting event, GRAAUW is now taking applications for two local scholarships of \$1,000.00 each. The application form is on our Website. Please share it with your contacts. Scholarship Committee members are notifying the financial aid offices of local community colleges and universities to be sure students are aware of this opportunity. Applications must be submitted by March 30.

Another \$2,400.00 will go to the AAUW Educational Opportunities Fund (#4336). This umbrella fund supports: grants and fellowships for scholars, researchers and professionals both in the U.S. and abroad, the weeklong Tech Trek camps for rising eighth-grade girls, the Fellows Alumnae Network, and the Undergraduate Scholarship Clearinghouse. This is where we see that small amounts from across the nation do have long term benefits to empower women and girls around the world.

Looking ahead, GRAAUW is filling a basket with items that will be coveted by "Strong Women." Our basket of goodies will be raffled at the State AAUW Conference in Portsmouth this April. Proceeds will support the Legal Advocacy Fund in confronting discrimination, harassment and retribution against women. We need items that provide reinforcement, courage, support, comfort, patience and joy...as we all need to be "Strong Women" Contact Louise Brierre about your contribution by March 9. 
