
Several GRAAUW members were very busy going to the General Assembly during the 2018 Legislative session. It was interesting to listen to the legislators and other committee members' opinions at the League of Women Voters Roundtable every Wednesday during the session.

The State Public Policy Chair Leslie Tourigney and the State Co-Presidents held an informative AAUW Lobby Day in February. Some members visited their legislators and gave them AAUW information. We then walked in the drizzling rain to meet with Lt. Governor Justin Fairfax who enthusiastically listened to our public policy issues. Then we visited Governor Ralph Northam. Since this is our fifth visit with him, he was very familiar with our issues so he gave us some encouraging news, especially concerning education. Our day ended with a ioint lunch with members of the League of Women Voters.

February 9 was a sad day at the House Privileges and Elections Committee and the Senate Rules Committee. Although both rooms were packed with Virginians wanting the Equal Rights Amendment to be put up for a vote, it was not heard in either house. Chairmen of both committees refused to bring up several bills to move Virginia along the way to becoming one of the last two states needed to ratify this important amendment, standing in the way of equal rights under the law for all Virginia women. Both houses stated that the time had passed for us to pass the ERA according to the US National Archives: however, this objection is not actually based on fact.

A radio show moderated by our own Patricia Wallace February 14 discussed the ERA's fate at the General Assembly. Pat Fishback, Eileen Davis, and Katie Hornung discussed the events with her.

Equal Pay Day 2018 will be observed on April 10— the date indicating how far into this year a woman must work to earn as much as a man earned in 2017.

Membership Renewal Time

It's that time of year again! Time to recommit to AAUW's mission and the Greater Richmond branch's action.

Renewing your membership involves paying your fiscal year 2018-2019 dues. For just one payment of \$95, you are renewing membership in the Greater Richmond Branch, AAUW National, and AAUW of Virginia. The National dues increased this year by \$10 for the first increase since 2008. Dues are:

AAUW National	\$59
AAUW of Virginia	\$15
GRAAUW	\$21
Total	\$95

You can deduct \$56 of the National portion from your taxes as a charitable contribution. Paid Life members pay only the state and branch portion for a total of \$36. Honorary Life (50-year) members pay nothing!

How to pay?

- You can pay online in the AAUW Member Services Database (MSD) using a credit card.
- 2. You can click the link in the email sent to you to pay online.
- 3. You can send a check to GRAAUW Finance Officer Jane Newell at 509 S. Cherry Street, Richmond, Virginia 23220.
- 4. You can bring a check to a meeting and save the stamp.

We will hold a drawing at the May Banquet of those who have already renewed. The winner will get the GRAAUW portion of the dues refunded.
