The Virginia General Assembly session opens for its short 45-day session on January 11, 2023

AAUW-VA Co Public Policy Chairs will hold a Pre-Session Public Policy Zoom meeting on January 5 at 5 p.m. At this statewide gathering you will learn how to advocate both in-person and virtually. AAUW-VA will introduce you to tools and resources that will be available throughout the session, highlight issues to watch for, and provide updates on our in-person Lobby Day plans for January 19 as well as how you can participate virtually.

The following **AAUW-VA legislative and policy priorities** are those we will focus on for the 2023 Virginia General Assembly legislative session and beyond:

• Protect access to abortion and women's right to make personal reproductive decisions with their medical care providers

• Eliminate systemic racism and sexism through changes to Virginia law and regulations

• Make childcare affordable and readily available for all families

Protect full access to voting

Ensure full public-school funding and protect teachers from harassment and liability claims

Here are some important dates on this upcoming Congressional District 4 Special Election to replace Rep. Donald McEachin, who passed away.

• **January 7, 2023**: First day of in-person early voting at your local registrar's office

• **February 14, 2023**: Deadline to register to vote or update an existing registration (Voters may register after this date, through Election Day, and vote using a provisional ballot).

• **February 10, 2023:** Deadline to apply for a ballot to be mailed to you. Your request must be received by your local voter registration office by 5:00 p.m.

• February 18, 2023 poll close at 5 PM: The last day of in-person early voting at your local voter registration office: Saturday,
