My goal is to highlight women's history, women's health and women's equality."

RECLAIM OUR VOTE/GET OUT THE VOTE POSTCARD CAMPAIGN 2023

Once again our GRAAUW Branch Public Policy Project for this year will be **Reclaim our Vote**, **ROV**, **Get out the Vote**, **GOTV**, postcard campaign. **ROV** is a campaign by the nonpartisan group, **Center for Common Ground**, that **AAUW VA** has collaborated with on this important project.

We will be handing out the names/addresses, script, postcards at 2 meetings in September, on September 18 and September 30. At our first Branch meeting on September 18, you can pick up your postcards, stamps, labels, and scripts to complete the postcards. Natima and I will do a short training on how to complete the postcards. We will also be getting together at 12 Noon for Lunch on Saturday September 30 following the NW District meeting at Panera Bread 11649 Midlothian Tnpk to have a second training on how to write and send these postcards.

Last year we completed 500+ postcards and this year we plan to complete at least 500 postcards again. Your help is greatly needed!!! Center for Common Ground showed a 6% increase in Voter participation last year after the statewide ROV/GOTV campaign.

We hope many of you will join us on **September 18 and September 30** to pick up what you will need to complete this important Public Policy Project. If you cannot be at either meeting Natima or I can help get you these postcards and materials to complete this project.

October 27, 5 p.m.	Deadline to apply to vote absentee by mail
November 4, 5 p.m.	Deadline to request replacement absentee ballot or vote early in- person at <u>your local registrar</u>
November 4, 2 p.m.	Deadline to request emergency absentee ballot
November 7	Deadline for postmark on absentee ballot submitted by mail
November 7, 6 a.m 7 p.m.	Election Day Voting at assigned polling places. Non-registered voters may register and submit a provisional ballot.
