GRAAUW PUBLIC POLICY UPDATE

At the time of this writing for the April-June GRAAUW Newsletter, we are still waiting on whether Governor Youngkin will sign or veto bills AAUW-VA supported that have passed both the House and Senate. Many of our initiatives passed both chambers of the General Assembly and the Governor has until early April to decide to either veto or sign these bills into law.

The next Public Policy Zoom Call will be on April 9 at 6 pm. I hope many of you will join that call. If you can't make it, I will send everyone out the recording for your review.

Public Policy both at the State and Federal level is so important and I am so grateful for all the support given by the AAUW-VA State Public Policy Chairs, Denise Murden and Janine Greenwood over the past year. They have provided information and support for our Get Out the Vote Campaign, wrote position papers on our public policy priorities, held numerous zoom calls, and followed important bills before and during the General Assembly. If it were not for these 2 individuals' hard work, we would not have been as successful as a branch getting as much done with public policy over the past few years

As I finish up 3 years as your Public Policy Chair, I want to thank you all for all your support over the past 3 years!! Many of you in the GRAAUW branch were actively involved with postcard writing for the Get Out the Vote Campaign for the past 3 years! You all wrote up to 50 postcards each and we completed 400-600 postcards each of the past 3 years!! Way to go GRAAUW branch members! We were also heavily involved with lobbying at the General Assembly each year. In addition to lobbying, this past January our branch provided food and set up for the AAUW-VA Legislative Women's reception at St Paul's Church that had not been held for several years due to Covid. We also as a branch lobbied in February at the Capital this year with the Fund Our School coalition to support increased funding for public schools. Many of you attended the numerous AAUW-VA Public Policy Zoom Calls prior, during and after the General Assembly sessions in order to follow bills that AAUW-VA was supporting and opposing. Thank you also for all the calls and emails to your General Assembly members as well as the Governor in support of many bills we were both supporting or opposing. Our Branch has been very active as far as public policy, and I am grateful for all your support.

Natima Jones has been my Co-chair for Public Policy for the past year and will now be the Public Policy Chair for the GRAAUW branch beginning in July. I have enjoyed getting to know Natima and I know she will do a great job as your Public Policy Chair for our branch moving forward.
