Dr. WaKabongo has received numerous awards for her leadership and service. On June 19, 2025, she was honored with the American Society for Microbiology (ASM) William A. Hinton Award for the Advancement of a Diverse Community of Microbiologists.

This prestigious award recognizes outstanding contributions to fostering research training of underrepresented groups and promoting diversity in microbiology. Named in memory of Dr. William A. Hinton—a pioneering physician-scientist and one of the first Black members of ASM who developed the highly effective Hinton test for syphilis—the award celebrates excellence, inclusivity, and scientific impact.

In 2021, Dr. WaKabongo made history by establishing the first **4-H program** in the Democratic Republic of the Congo. Part of a global network spanning more than 80 countries, 4-H equips young people with leadership and life skills through hands-on learning. Its four pillars—Head, Heart, Hands, and Health—guide youth toward a lifetime of success and service.
